Shout Section Band to Perform on June 20

Washington Township has scheduled Chicago's premier big band, "Shout Section Big Band" to perform at the Beecher Amvet Hall on June 20 at 7 pm. The band is directed and managed by Beecher native Brett Dean, who has been involved in music his entire life and is currently the band director at St. Charles Middle School in St. Charles IL.

Since then, they have been entertaining audiences at swing dances, city concerts, school clinics, weddings and corporate events all over the Midwest. Staffed by some of the best musicians in the Chicago area, the evening should be a great night of music.

Senior Assessment Freeze Help Offered

Assessor Carol Ann Blume has announced that Staff from the Will County Supervisor of Assessments will be at the Washington Township Center on April 22 from 9:30 am to 1:00 pm to assist seniors in completing their exemption forms.

To qualify for the exemption you must be at least 65 years old with a total household income of LESS than \$55,000 and live in your home.

Disabled persons exemptions are also renewable at this time. If you have already received your senior freeze assessment application or if you have not received a form and feel that you qualify, we encourage you to visit the township center for assistance.

Washington Township Food Pantry Ready To Help

Trustee Paul Goldrick recently reported that Washington Township Food Pantry assisted 424 households and over 1,200 people in 2014. The pantry received cash donations totaling over \$500 and received over 30,000 pounds of food from the Greater Chicago Food Depository and countless food donations from caring residents, businesses, local food drives, groups and organizations. Since moving the pantry from the Washington Township Center to the Beecher Community Building two years ago, the township has added refrigeration equipment and regularly offers frozen and refrigerated products for the many people utilizing the pantry. The pantry is also stocked with toiletries and other non-food items.

Washington Township Rural Neighborhood Watch Program


The Washington Township "Neighborhood Crime Watch" program for the rural residents of the township is up and running.



ROAD DISTRICT NEWS FROM HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER JERRY MEYER

Spring is here — another winter has passed. Even though this winter wasn't as bad as last year, we did have our share of cold and snow. In the Midwest it seems we have only two road seasons: construction season and repair season. We are in the repair season now, trying to fix all of the potholes. We have used over 65 tons of cold patch this winter, filling by hand - one pothole at a time. We don't count them like the big city, but we do have enough of them to fill. Good weather permitting, we will continue patching until they all get filled.

That brings us to the construction season: YES! Here are some projects we have scheduled for the year: Corning Road from Cottage Grove east to Stoney Island is scheduled for completion this year with 10 inches of stone and two layers of tar and chip. The base of the road will be leveled and



ditches pitched for drainage. During that time the roadway might be closed in sections, but all residents living in this area will be able to get out and return to their homes. Until the road is completed, thru traffic should avoid that area of Corning Road this summer. Sorry for the inconvenience and timing to finish this project but last summer's wet weather caused the delay in getting the road completed. We have also budgeted to reseal five miles of other roads, but we haven't determined which roads will be addressed because it will depend on how they survived the spring thaw.

I do have a favor to ask all of you: when you see road work being done, please slow down and give us a BRAKE. All road workers want to go home at the end of their shift. These dedicated workers are out there to improve the roads for you and keep you as safe as possible. This year, the Midwest winter took a toll on all state, county and local roads, so you can expect road repairs just about everywhere you travel. Please keep a watchful eye on the road and remember: state law requires hands **free** on the cell phone, **no texting** while driving, and keep your hands on the wheel.

If you have any questions about the roads, please give me a call at the Township Office at 708-946-6459 and I will try to answer your questions. Have a safe spring and summer, and remember, the snow and cold will return in due time. Enjoy the warm summer.


