# Beecher Women's Club Celebrates 100 Years!

The Women's Club of Beecher serves as the oldest philanthropic organization in Washington Township. This group of women has been meeting, organizing service activities, and supporting others in Beecher for over 100 years!

How did the Women's Club of Beecher begin? In 1922, Mrs. Maude Stites asked some of her friends to join her at her home for coffee and a discussion about the formation of a club. The first gathering included these fifteen forward thinking women: Dorothy Bahlman, Tillie Bielfeldt, Flora Ehrhardt, Vivian Ehrhardt, Gertrude Hack, Marie Hack, Ina Heldt, Violet Heldt, Rose Hunte, Erna Knuth, Myrtle Myrick, Pearl Schultz, Maude Stites, Winnie Wegert, and Lina Wehling.



The club was founded on March 7, 1922, and many of these ladies' descendants are members of the club today. It began as the Women's Welfare Club of Beecher and the object of the club would be both civic and charitable. Some of their first projects included beautification of the village. Funds were raised to build a bandstand and install a water fountain in Firemen's Park. They were also set on improving Veterans' Memorial Park by the train depot. Founding member Myrtle Myrick was believed to have raised and lowered the flag at the memorial park for over fifty years.

Over the years the Women's Club has contributed to many projects: Red Cross, Beecher Community schools, March of Dimes, food drives, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Salvation Army, Frosty Friends, Women's Welfare Club Park, bronze memorial plaques, as well as active participation and support of the Beecher Centennial in 1970 and the Quasquicentennial in 1995.

The blood drives in Beecher were started by the Women's Club in 1975. In 1977, the club began their own scholarship for a graduating senior of Beecher High School. They have also had a long-time connection with the Beecher Community Library. The library began as a free lending library in the home of member Jean Ohlendorf.

Over the last decade, the club has sponsored several spring teas and holiday craft bazaars.

They recently celebrated their 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary dinner at the Princess Cafe. It was a special evening honoring members past and present for their contributions to the club and the community as follows:

# Washington Township Senior News

### Assessment Freeze Help Offered on May 10

Assessor Pat Peters has announced that her office will be offering assistance to Washington Township residents on May 10 from 10 am to 1:00 pm to assist seniors in completing their exemption forms. Former Assessor Mary Tamez will be assisting with the application process. No appointments are necessary - first come first serve.

Disabled persons exemptions are also renewable at this time. If you have already received your senior freeze assessment application or if you have not received a form and feel that you qualify, we encourage you to visit the township center for assistance.

#### **ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR A TAX EXEMPTION?**

There are many exemptions that you may qualify for! Call Assessor Peter's office if you qualify for any of the exemptions listed below.

#### **General Homestead Exemption**

•Do you live on the property, a named owner on the deed, and it is your principal residence? You qualify! This exemption is added and removed by our office, there is no form. ALWAYS check your property tax bill to make sure you have it if you qualify.

#### **Disabled Person Exemption**

• Are you collecting disability? You qualify! Please bring in the proof of disability or come to the office to get the form for the doctor to fill out for the proof and we will assist you with the exemption form.

#### **Senior Homestead Exemption**

•Do you turn 65 this year and a named owner on the deed? You qualify! Bring in your drivers license or ID for proof of age and we will assist you in the application.

#### **Senior Freeze Exemption**

•Are you 65 and have a total household income of less than \$65,000? You qualify! Bring in your current "Federal" income tax form and/or any forms you would normally take to have your income taxes done. If you meet the filing requirements, we will have the forms in our office after April 1st and can assist you in filling out the form.

#### **Disabled Veteran**

•Are you a Veteran with at least 30% service-connected disability through the Department of Veterans Affairs and a named owner on the deed? You qualify! Bring in a copy of your DD 214 as well as the proof of disability for the current year you are applying for that lists your percentage of disability and we will assist you in filling out the form.

#### From the Beecher Fire Protection District

Why is your address so important? In an emergency, it is crucial to have your 9-1-1 address posted for emergency services to locate you. Every second counts in a life and death situation, and without proper identification, they may be unable to locate you. *Address Markers/Numbers should...* 

- **Be Visible in the Dark** Put the numbers on your house under a light. Numbers on a mailbox or post should be reflective or on a highly contrasting background. Numbers need to be at least 3" in height and must be reflective.
- **Be Uncovered** Several times per year, trim the bushes, vines, flowers, and weeds so ALL numbers are clearly visible. Move flower baskets, flags, and other items that may obstruct a clear view.
- Be Posted Twice on Long or Shared

  Driveways If the driveway leads to more than one address, post all numbers at the end of the driveway, and also post the correct number on each building. Your 9-1-1 numbers should be posted where they are easy to see from the road.
- Be Visible from Both Directions

### 9-1-1 Reflective Address Sign Program

GPS is great, but it doesn't always work on country roads. Your address sign is how emergency crews will find you when you call 9-1-1. Make sure it measures up!

Sign mounted between 4 and 7 feet abovegrade

We are currently offering blue reflective signs with your 9-1-1 address for \$10.00. Applications for the signs can be obtained on our website or in our front office at Station 44 located at 711 Penfield Street. Please indicate on the order form if you'd like your sign installed by our firefighters or if you would prefer to install your sign on your own. These signs are not available for residents outside of the Beecher Fire Protection District service area.

### **News From the Community Building Board of Managers**

This past year has seen many improvements at the Washington Township Community Hall. The sidewalks and entrance stairs have all been replaced as well as ramp access and new railings added. A stamped pad was put in around the cannon to add additional flare. After the sidewalk installation was finished, the grounds around the building were landscaped to not only help improve the exterior view but to also help alleviate some of the drainage issues the building has had for decades. We will soon be planting new Japanese Red Maple trees on the west side of the building (to replace the trees that had to be removed) for additional curb appeal. Some of the upcoming projects we will be focusing on are to possibly have some tuck-pointing and masonry repairs completed as well as having the outside fire escape painted.

### Township Offers General Assistance for those in Need

Washington Township provides many important functions that economically improve the quality of life in our community. One of our goals at the Township is to assess, address and advocate for the needs and concerns of Township residents. We provide support and assist individuals and/or families in times of need.

Beyond being a resource for residents, Washington Township administers **General Assistance** to help sustain people in situations, who are not otherwise eligible for federal or state assistance programs, and we administer the emergency assistance program to help people in emergency situations with evictions and utility disconnections. We also work with our residents to coordinate other charitable and governmental programs that may help them in their time of need.

# Township to Offer Early Voting for June General Primary Election

Washington Township will once again be offering Early Voting for the 2022 General Primary Election to be held on June 28.


Early Voting will be held at the Washington Township Center located at 30200 Town Center Road in Beecher, on Monday through Friday from June 13 through June 24 from 9 am to 3 pm. Voting will also be available on Saturday, June 18 from 9 am to noon. All residents of Washington Township (Beecher) are eligible to vote at our site. The process is quick and 100% secure.

There is still time to register to vote. The last day to register to vote online is June 12 and you can still register to vote in-person, up until and on election day on June 28. Registration is available at numerous locations throughout the area including the Will County's Clerk Office, the Washington Township Center, and the Village of Beecher Village Hall during normal business hours.

The General Primary Election is held prior to the November General Election, commonly known as the midterm elections, in which all 435 seats in the House of Representatives and 35 of the 100 seats in the Senate will be contested. Thirty-nine state and territorial gubernatorial and numerous other state and local elections will also be contested.


Clerk Joe Burgess is urging people to utilize Early Voting if they can't get to the polls on Election Day or just prefer to not deal with lines and crowds.


### **UPCOMING TOWNSHIP ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS for 2022**

- ◆ Tar & chip Racine Ave from Indiana Ave to Church Road
- **♦ Tar & chip Delite Inn Road from Route 1 to Cottage Grove Ave.**
- ◆ Tar & Chip Kentucky Road from Ashland Ave to Route 1

Ongoing Maintenance for the Season includes:

- ♦ Asphalt patching as needed
- ♦ Grading as needed
- ♦ Culvert assessments / repair or replace as needed
- ♦ Seal coating as needed
- ♦ Roadside ditch mowing (especially corners)
- ♦ Address any drainage issues









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
