We have 1426 Townships in Illinois that maintain over 72,000 miles of roads. That's more than 50% of all roads in Illinois! As like most townships in Illinois, Washington Township offers many other services than just road maintenance. We offer our residents:

Research shows that it would cost far more for another government (i.e. county highway) to provide the same level of service that townships provide! Some counties in central and southern Illinois cannot even maintain county roads and townships maintain the roads for them!

 Township government is the most cost-efficient unit of local government and has the lowest number of full-time employees

- Lowest debt of all government
- Lowest expense per capita" Any other form of government would not be able to provide the same level of service at this cost
- Townships account for only around 2% of the property tax bill statewide! These proposals will not solve the property tax problem in Illinois
- Township government is your closest form of government and is the most valuable to the residents in its area
- Township Officials are only a phone call away!

If you don't want to see Springfield, just take away your townships, without even letting you decide, please call

your state senator and representative(s) and express your concerns before they vote on this! Don't let them abolish the only form of efficient government to try and "save money"! Hello Friends and Neighbors-

Welcome to the Spring addition of the Washington Township Newsletter. This newsletter, as you may guess is chocked full of useful information for you and your family, with up-and-coming activities, events and news you can use. I will keep my contribution short so as to leave room for all the valuable content in the pages within.

There is one piece of news that is on the horizon concerning your Township, however. You have heard the quote by Abraham Lincoln in his Gettysburg address of 1863, ".... government of the people, by the people, for the people shall not parish from this earth". A proposal has been presented by a legislator to streamline government, made in the form of a House Bill and a Senate Bill that would dissolve townships of 500 people or less (House Bill) and consolidate townships which are 5000 people or less (Senate Bill). What does this mean for our Township. Washington Township is over 5000 people so we would remain intact. BUT this is what would happen! Washington Township could be forced, for example, to absorb neighboring Will Township or Peotone Township (population approximately 4400). That means, general assistance, all roads and right of ways, snow plowing, zoning, senior and youth programs, assessments, buildings, etc. would fall under the umbrella of Washington Township. Additional labor would need to be employed, additional equipment purchased and services in general would suffer. All of this cost money, so taxes would need to increase. Does this make sense? It is not reducing government it is making government bigger. It would no longer be the government of the people, by the people, for the people. We as your Washington Township Board are against the proposed bills.

We need to keep Beecher a Beautiful place to Be!

Beware of IRS Phone Scams

With the **2024** tax season nearly over, the IRS reminds seniors to remain alert to aggressive and threatening phone calls by criminals impersonating IRS agents. The callers claim to be IRS employees and sound very convincing but are **NOT**.

The truth is the IRS or its authorized agencies will NEVER:

- Call to demand immediate payment using a specific payment method such as a prepaid debit card, gift card or wire transfer. The IRS does not use these methods for tax payments. Generally, the IRS will first mail a bill to any taxpayer who owes taxes.
- Threaten to immediately bring in local police or other law enforcement groups to have the taxpayer arrested for not paying.
- **Demand** that taxes be paid without giving the taxpayer the opportunity to question or appeal the amount owed.
- **Ask** for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.

If you ever receive one of these calls, REMEMBER: Never give out personal information and hang-up immediately!

Assessment Freeze Help Offered on June 4

Assessor Pat Peters has announced that her office will be offering assistance to Washington Township residents on **June 4 from 10 am to 2 pm** to assist seniors in completing their exemption forms. County workers will be assisting with the application process. No appointments are necessary first come first serve.

Disabled persons exemptions are also renewable at this time. If you have already received your senior freeze assessment application or if you have not received a form and feel that you qualify, we encourage you to visit the township center for assistance.

Are you eligible for a tax exemption?

There are many exemptions that you may qualify for! Call Assessor Peter's office if you qualify for any of the exemptions listed below.

General Homestead Exemption

•Do you live on the property, a named owner on the deed, and it is your principal residence? You qualify! This exemption is added and removed by our office, there is no form. ALWAYS check your property tax bill to make sure you have it if you qualify.

Disabled Person Exemption

• Are you collecting disability? You qualify! Please bring in the proof of disability or come to the office to get the form for the doctor to fill out for the proof and we will assist you with the exemption form.

Senior Homestead Exemption

•Do you turn 65 this year and a named owner on the deed? You qualify! Bring in your drivers license or ID for proof of age and we will assist you in the application.

Senior Freeze Exemption

•Are you 65 and have a total household income of less than \$65,000? You qualify! Bring in your current "Federal" income tax form and/or any forms you would normally take to have your income taxes done. If you meet the filing requirements, we will have the forms in our office after April 1st and can assist you in filling out the form.

Disabled Veteran

•Are you a Veteran with at least 30% service-connected disability through the Department of Veterans Affairs and a named owner on the deed? You qualify! Bring in a copy of your DD 214 as well as the proof of disability for the current year you are applying for that lists your percentage of disability and we will assist you in filling out the form.

Barn Fire Safety: Protecting Your Livestock and Property

Barn fires can be devastating, causing the loss of valuable livestock, equipment, and property. The Beecher Fire Protection District is committed to helping farmers and property owners reduce the risk of barn fires through prevention and preparedness.



Common Causes of Barn Fires

- *Electrical Issues* Faulty wiring, overloaded circuits, and improper use of extension cords can spark fires.
- Heating Equipment Space heaters, heat lamps, and other heating devices can ignite flammable materials.
- Flammable Materials Hay, straw, bedding, and dust are highly combustible if not properly stored.
- Smoking and Open Flames Cigarettes, welding, or open flames can quickly start a fire in dry environments.
- Equipment and Machinery Overheated engines, fuel leaks, and poor maintenance can lead to fires.

Fire Prevention Measures

- *Electrical Safety* Have all wiring inspected by a licensed electrician and avoid using extension cords as permanent wiring.
- **Proper Storage** Store hay and other flammable materials in a dry, well-ventilated area to reduce the risk of spontaneous combustion.
- Safe Heating Practices Keep heating devices away from flammable materials and never leave them unattended.
- **No Smoking** Prohibit smoking in and around barns and enforce strict fire safety rules.
- Regular Equipment Maintenance Inspect and clean machinery frequently to prevent overheating and fuel leaks.

Emergency Preparedness

- **Fire Extinguishers** Place fire extinguishers at key locations and ensure all staff knows how to use them.
- **Escape Plans** Develop and practice an emergency plan, including livestock evacuation strategies.

By implementing these fire safety measures, barn owners can help protect their animals, equipment, and livelihood from the devastating effects of fire. The Beecher Fire Protection District encourages all property owners to stay vigilant and proactive in fire prevention efforts.



Washington Township Medical Closet

Washington Township residents can take advantage of the township's Medical Closet for many of their "short term" medical equipment needs. The medical closet typically has wheelchairs, walkers, canes, crutches, and shower chairs in inventory and available for checkout. There is no cost to residents to borrow items and we simply ask that all items be returned clean when they are no longer needed. The Kicking It Back Center Adds ADA Ramp

The Kicking It Back Center (KIB) recently installed an ADA handicap ramp to allow for easier access into their building. The project included the ramp, railing and replacing the sidewalk on Kicking It Back's property. The Village of Beecher graciously agreed to replace the old and uneven public sidewalks in front of the building. The total cost of the project was \$12,500. KIB's share of the project was \$10,000, which will be covered by a grant received from Will County. The Village used TIF funds to pay \$2,500 to replace the public sidewalk. Thanks again to the Village Board for recognizing the importance of this project!

The Kicking It Back Center is a non-profit organization that offers local residents Senior Programs, Youth Programs, Exercise Programs, Karate, Guitar Lessons (call for availability and details) and other activities at no cost. Senior programs include exercise, yoga, Zumba, bunco, bingo, pinochle and much more!

The center is now fully ADA compliant with the new ramp and an ADA washroom, which was added in 2024.

The karate program, started in 2006 by owner Juan Hernandez, who holds a 8 degree Blackbelt in karate, has produced over 100 "National" karate titles and 47 "World Championship" medalists, including 12 "World Champions". In 2024, Sensei Hernandez and his team took Jenna Huskisson, Joe Huskisson and Hunter Ogle to Greece and Portugal for the World Championships and these remarkable athletes combined for 26 medals.
